While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen concentration and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the *Concordia University of Edmonton Calendar* for more information regarding registration policies.

You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The *Concordia University of Edmonton Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

All students in a Bachelor of Arts program must complete the Core Requirements as outlined in the table below, plus an additional 3 credits of Fine Arts (ARTH, DAN, DRA, MUS or MUP).

Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both concentration and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both concentration and minor requirements. (Example: ENG 100 or (ENG 101 or ENG 111) and (ENG 102 or ENG 112) taken toward an English minor simultaneously fulfill the Humanities core requirement).

Major Requirements

45-60 credits required to include:

Performance: 9 credits

- a) MUP 126 and 127
- b) 3 credits chosen from MUP 142 and 143, 162 and 163, 164 and 165, 166 and 167, or 168 and 169
- c) 3 credits chosen from MUP 226 and 227, 242 and 243, 262 and 263, 264 and 265, 266 and 267, or 268 and 269

Theory and Composition: 12 credits

- d) MUS 211 and 212
- e) MUS 213 and 214
- f) 3 credits chosen from MUS 311, 312, 315, 316 or 313 and 314

Note: In order to be successful in all areas of the degree, it is recommended that students take MUS 211 by their third year.

History and Literature: 6 credits

- g) 6 credits chosen from MUS 261, 262, 263, 281, 282, or 380-series

Conducting and Pedagogy: 3 credits

- h) 3 credits chosen from MUS 295, 321, 361 or MUED 212, 213 or 214 or from the MUS 370-series

Capstone: 3 credits

- i) MUS 490

Senior Project/Recital: 3 credits

- j) MUP 495 and 496 or MUS 495 and 496

Unspecified: 9-24 credits

- k) 9-18 credits of unspecified senior-level Music courses
- l) 0-6 credits of junior- or senior-level Music courses

Note: Students with a major in Music must complete a minimum of 12 credits of Music at Concordia University of Edmonton. Students may be required to take MUS 100 and/or MUS 120 depending on their level of proficiency in music theory.

Sample Program

Below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. Keep in mind that this is only an example; you may find that a different sequence works best for you.

Some Music requirements have a credit value of 1.5; all courses within the sample program are worth 3 credits in each semester, unless otherwise indicated below.
