General Skill Sets

A Bachelor of Arts degree is versatile. Graduates are employed in almost every industry and every company in North America. When employers are hiring, they are interested in transferable skills attained through university study. Examples include:

- Ability to analyze policies, public issues, legislation or the operations and activities of governments, business corporations and regional, non-governmental and international organizations.
- Research skills developed in course work-observing and analyzing institutions, political processes, public policy and law relating to domestic and international politics
- Study of public opinion, political parties, elections, interest groups, social movements, non-governmental organizations, inter-governmental relations, international law and organizations
- Ability to collect, analyze and interpret data/ compare and contrast information (for example, election results and surveys, public documentation).
- Ability to make projections
- Knowledge of governmental and non-governmental organizations
- A strong interest in political affairs and research
- Strong written, oral communication & decision making skills
- Problem-solving skills
- Critical and analytical thinking skills and the ability to understand the world
- Exposure to a variety of political, cultural and community perspectives
- Initiative and the ability to work effectively in groups or alone
- Organizational skills
- Ability to access and explain information in the context of conflict resolution
- Critical listening skills

Often, university graduates who have been employed for approximately two years may transition to a new job. Although factors such as the state of economy and work performance may affect one's career journey, there tends to be a greater potential for people who have degrees to be promoted or to attain leadership positions.

As graduates combine their degree with accumulated work experience, they may transition into positions with increased responsibilities and higher salaries, or leave their current employer to take new roles elsewhere.
