Major Requirements

42-60 credits required, to include:

- a. 6 credits of junior-level ENG
- b. 6 credits chosen from ENG 323, 324, 330, 331, 338, 339
- c. 6 credits chosen from ENG 341, 342, 343, 344, 350, 354, 356
- d. One of ENG 365, 366, or 367
- e. One of ENG 381, 382, 383, or 384
- f. One of ENG 392, 393, 394, or 395
- g. One of WRI 300, WRI 310, WRI 391, or WRI 392
- h. 3 credits from the ENG 401-425 series or from ENG 480
- i. ENG 491 or 492
- j. 6-24 credits of unspecified senior level ENG or WRI courses

In addition to the above, students must complete:

- k. 6 credits of courses offered by the Departments of Fine Arts, Philosophy and Religious Studies, Literature and Languages except ENG or WRI (ARAB, ARTH, CHIN, CLAS, CLIT, CREE, DRA, FR, GERM, GRK, HEBR, LAT, MUS, MUP, MUED264, PHIL, POPC, REL, SPA).
- l. 6 credits of courses in the Faculty of Science.
- m. 6 credits of courses offered by the Departments of Social Sciences and/or Psychology (CNST, ECO, HIS, INDG, POEC, PSCI, PSY, SOC).

Permissible minors:

All minors listed in [section 10.6](#), except for English and Forensic Studies.
