- 3. Each year, at or near the conclusion of the second semester you will be asked to complete an R-T5556TY questionnaire and a R-SEXII questionaire.
- 4. At the conclusion of your final year of the program, your grades will be obtained from the Registrar's records at CUCA.

Participation in this research is entirely voluntary now and on each future occasion, and if you agree to participate you may withdraw your consent at any time. We will track your survey by student ID number as we need to correlate your responses with the responses you will be asked to provide at various points in your program, however we will not be matching your name with your student identification number, and the confidentiality of your responses is assured. We also ask you for permission to access your final grade for the math courses you take in the BEd After-Degree program, specifically EDUC8967 and EDUC3366. We will be matching this information to your survey responses using your student number rather than your name so as to not identify you. You may decline to participate in this study by simply not returning the consent form. There will be no negative consequences to you should you decide not to participate.

No findings that could identify any individual participant will be published. Access to data is restricted to the three above-named researchers. Coded data will be stored for a minimum of five years after the completion of final analysis.
