While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen concentration and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the *Concordia Calendar* for more information regarding registration policies. You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The *Concordia Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

General Studies Major

This multidisciplinary program allows students to gain understanding and experience in more than one discipline without the requirement that the learning be integrated. Students would be able to select two or more concentrations for study, customizing their course selections to meet their own interests and career aspirations.

Students for the four-year Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in General Studies:

- a) must complete 2 or 3 concentrations from section 10.1.2.D, *Concentration Requirements*
 - i) if only completing 2 concentrations, may choose to complete a minor consisting of at least 18 credits, of which 6 credits must be at the senior level
 - ii) may include core course requirements in the concentrations and minor. However, the same courses may not be completed in 2 concentrations or a concentration and the minor.
- b) Only 42 credits are permitted in any discipline of a concentration of the General Studies major

Sample Program

Below is a sample sequence of courses if you are entering your first year of a Bachelor of Arts-General Studies program and are undecided about your concentrations.

	Fall Semester	Winter Semester
Year 1	ENG 100 or 111 REL 101 or 150 Minor Elective (LOE*) Social Science	ENG 100 or 112 Fine Arts Minor Elective (LOE*) Social Science

***Note:**

If you do not have a 30-level Language Other than English (LOE), you must complete a 102-level LOE to meet this requirement. It is recommended to take it in the first year of your program, and then complete the 6 credit LOE Core Requirement in your second year.

If you have a 30 level LOE, you only need to complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement which is recommended to be taken in your first year of your program.
