## Program Planner 2014-2015

While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen major and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the Concordia Calendar for more information regarding registration policies. You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The Concordia Calendar is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both major and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both major and minor requirements. (Example: courses taken toward a History minor simultaneously fulfills Social Science core).

## Sample Program

Below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. Keep in mind that this is only an example; you may find that a different sequence works best for you. Both sample programs meet the minimum requirements for the Basic and Enhanced programs.

Some English courses are not offered every year and that some electives may be required to fulfill additional English credits required for the major.

## Major Requirements- Basic

## 36-45 credits required to include:

a) ENG 100 or 111 and 112 (ENG 100 strongly recommended)
b) One of ENG 323, 324, 330, or 331
c) ENG 338 or 339
d) 6 credits chosen from ENG 341, 342, 343, 350, 354, 355, or 356
e) One of ENG 365, 366, 367, 392, 393, 394, 395, 396, 397, or 398
f) One of ENG 381, 382, 383, or 384
g) One of ENG 303, 304, 342, 356, or 396 (see Note 2, below)
h) 3 credits chose from the ENG 401-425 series or ENG 480 (see Note 3, below)
i) ENG 491 or 492 (see Note 4, below)
j) 3-12 credits of unspecified senior-level English Courses

## Note:

1. In addition to 36 or more credits of English, all 4 -year English majors may also count up to 12 credits chosen from CLAS 201, WRI 300, WRI 310, WRI 391, WRI 392, C LIT 201 and C LIT 202 as part of their English major.
2. ENG 342 or ENG 356 may also simultaneously be used in partial fulfillment of requirement (d); ENG 396 may also simultaneously fulfill requirement (e).
3. With the approval of the English Department Coordinator, courses in the ENG 401-425 series may meet one of the distribution requirements (b) to ( g ), depending on the topic.
4. Students intending to pursue graduate studies are encouraged to take both ENG 491 and 492.

## *Note:

If you do not have a 30 -level Language Other than English (LOE), you must complete a 102 -level LOE to meet this requirement. It is recommended to take it in the first year of your program, and then complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement in your second year/.

If you have a 30 level LOE, you only need to complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement which is recommended to be taken in your first year of your program.
