While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen concentration and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the *Concordia Calendar* for more information regarding registration policies. You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The *Concordia Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both concentration and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both concentration and minor requirements. (Example: courses taken toward a History minor simultaneously fulfill the Social Science core).

Concentration Requirements

24-30 credits required to include:

- a) FR 203
- b) FR 250
- c) FR 303 and 312
- d) FR 372
- e) One of FR 492, 493, or 494
- f) 0-6 credits of unspecified senior-level French courses

Note: Students who take FR 303 as a FR 492 capstone or FR 312 as a FR 493 capstone course must complete an additional 3 credits of unspecified senior-level French.

Below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. Keep in mind that this is only an example; you may find a different sequence works best for you.

Note: Some electives may be used to fulfill additional French credits required for the concentration.
