While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen concentration and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the *Concordia Calendar* for more information regarding registration policies. You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The *Concordia Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both concentration and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both concentration and minor requirements. (Example: courses taken toward a History concentration simultaneously fulfill the Social Science core).

Concentration Requirements

When you have decided upon your concentration or major for the Bachelor of Arts degree, please use the *Program Planner* for that area of study.

Concordia offers 3-year BA degrees with concentrations in Drama, English, French, History, Music, Philosophy, Political Economy, Psychology, Religious Studies, and Sociology.

Concordia also offers 4-year BA degrees with majors in English, Music, Psychology (Applied Emphasis), Religious Studies, Religious Studies (Applied Emphasis), and Sociology.

Note: The 4-year BA with a major in Psychology (Applied Emphasis) is a competitive program; please speak to an Admissions Advisor about the [Admission Requirements](#).

Sample Program

Below is a sample sequence of courses if you are entering your first year of a Bachelor of Arts program and are undecided about your concentration.

*To earn a 3-year Bachelor of Arts degree, students must present credit in a 30-level or equivalent (e.g., French 30 or FR 102) Language Other than English (LOE). If you must complete a 102-level LOE to meet this requirement, we recommend you take it in the first year of your program.
