While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen concentration and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the *Concordia Calendar* for more information regarding registration policies. You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The *Concordia Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both major and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both major and minor requirements. (Example: courses taken toward a History minor simultaneously fulfills Social Science core).

Major Requirements

45-60 credits required to include:

Performance: 9 credits

- a) MUP 126 and 127
- b) 3 credits chosen from MUP 142 and 143, 164 and 165, 166 and 167, or 168 and 169
- c) 3 credits chosen from MUP 226 and 227, 242 and 243, 264 and 265, 266 and 267, or 268 and 269

Theory and Composition: 12 credits

- d) MUS 211 and 212
- e) MUS 213 and 214
- f) 3 credits chosen from MUS 311, 312, 315, 316 or 313 and 314

History and Literature: 6 credits

- g) 6 credits chosen from MUS 261, 262, 263, 281, 282, or 380-series

Conducting and Pedagogy: 3 credits

- h) 3 credits chosen from MUS 295, 321, 361 or MUED 212, 213 or 214 or from the MUS 370-series

Capstone: 3 credits

- i) MUS 490

Senior Project/Recital: 3 credits

- j) MUP 495 and 496 or MUS 495 and 496

Unspecified: 9-24 credits

- k) 9-21 credits of unspecified senior-level Music courses
- l) 0-3 credits of junior- or senior-level Music courses

Note: Students with a major in Music must complete a minimum of 12 credits of Music at Concordia.

Sample Program

Below is a sample sequence of courses for your degree. Keep in mind that this is only an example; you may find that a different sequence works best for you.

Note:

- Due to some Music requirements have a credit value of 1.5; all courses within the sample program are worth 3 credits in each semester, unless otherwise indicated below.
- Students can take up to 16.5 credits in a semester, with a maximum of 30 credits per academic year.

*If you do not have a 30-level Language Other than English (LOE), you must complete a 102-level LOE to meet this requirement. It is recommended to take it in the first year of your program, and then complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement in your second year.

*If you have a 30 level LOE, you only need to complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement which is recommended to be taken in your first year of your program.

† If MUP [1.5 credit] courses are used to fulfill partial credits of requirement l) of the Music Major, additional MUP/MUS credits may need to be completed through electives spots within the sample program.

‡ Students must complete 2 [1.5 credit] MUP courses of corresponding course codes (e.g., MUP 126/MUP 127 or MUP 168/MUP 169) to fulfill 3 credits.
