While your degree planning is directed by the specific requirements for your chosen concentration and minor, it is also driven by your own personal interests; therefore, it is most effective when you are the master of your own academic planning.

Please be aware of all prerequisites, corequisites, and other registration regulations for all courses required within your degree. Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. Refer to section 4.0 in the *Concordia Calendar* for more information regarding registration policies. You are responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree. The *Concordia Calendar* is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

*Core course requirements may be fulfilled through both major and minor requirements; however, the same course may not be counted toward both major and minor requirements. (Example: courses taken toward a History minor simultaneously fulfill Social Science core).*

## Major Requirements- Applied Emphasis

### 45-60 credits required to include:

- a) REL 101 and 102
- b) REL 201 and 202
- c) REL 248, 252, 253, 359, 373, 375, and 376
- d) One of REL 320, 321, 322, 323 or 331
- e) One of REL 362, 364, 365, 367, or 382
- f) REL 499
- g) 3-18 credits of unspecified senior level Religious Studies courses

## Religious Studies (Applied Emphasis) Minor

### 24 credits required to include:

- h) EDPS 200
- i) RELA 288
- j) RELA 301
- k) RELA 302
- l) RELA 303
- m) RELA 304
- n) RELA 444
- o) RELA 445

### In addition to the above courses, students must complete:

- p) PSY 324 or SOC 375
- q) One of MUS 261, MUS 262, DRA 325, DRA 352, or SOC 261
- r) RELA 450

**Note:** To become certified as a Director of Parish Services by Lutheran Church-Canada, students must also complete RELA 501 as the fifth year internship.

† Indicates that additional prerequisite planning is required to register in this course. Recommended to complete prerequisites for these courses in the Social Science and Fine Arts areas as indicated within the sample program (Would include; PSY 104/PSY 105 and/or SOC 100, and/or DRA 149 or 3 credits of MUS).

### \*Note:

If you do not have a 30-level Language Other than English (LOE), you must complete a 102-level LOE to meet this requirement. It is recommended to take it in the first year of your program, and then complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement in your second year.

If you have a 30 level LOE, you only need to complete the 6 credit LOE Core requirement which is recommended to be taken in your first year of your program.
