

Judith C. Meier Excellence In Teaching Award

The Judith C. Meier Excellence in Teaching Award is awarded to a continuing faculty member who, over a period of more than ten (10) years, continues to make outstanding contributions to teaching, and inspires students to do their very best.

This award is in honour of Judith C. Meier, an outstanding professor of History at Concordia, who exemplified Excellence In Teaching.

This is not an annual award, and is bestowed only if there is a worthy recipient. When given, the award is presented at the Concordia Recognition Dinner.

Criteria

- 1. The recipient exhibits a continuing and current interest in scholarship and effectively communicates a broad and lively understanding of their discipline to students through their commitment to the life of the mind.
- 2. The recipient is fondly remembered by alumni for the influence they have had on their lives.
- 3. The recipient has a consistent record of high performance in teaching according to student evaluations, administrative and peer reviews.
- 4. The recipient is someone who demonstrates integrity in both their personal and professional life.
- 5. The recipient demonstrates a commitment to the Mission of Concordia University of Edmonton and the proven ability to integrate faith with teaching and scholarship.
