Program planning can be very effective to identify potential courses needed in addition to specific requirements. You are also responsible for registering in and completing the courses necessary to obtain your degree as per section 10.0. The Concordia University of Edmonton Calendar is the final authority regarding program requirements and academic regulations.

### **Concentration Requirements**

#### 24-30 credits required, to include:

- a. DRA 101 or 102
- b. DRA 149
- c. One of DRA 325, 350, 353 or 383
- d. One of DRA 247, 353 or 352
- e. DRA 307
- f. DRA 495
- g. 6-12 credits of unspecified DRA courses. A maximum of 9 credits of junior-level Drama courses may be counted towards a Drama concentration.

#### In addition to the above, students must complete:

- h. 6 credits of junior-level ENG courses
- 6 credits of courses offered by the Departments of Philosophy and Religious Studies, Literature and Language other than English and Fine Arts except Drama (ARAB, ARTH, CHIN, CLAS, CLIT, CREE, FR, GERM, GRK, HEBR, LAT, MUS, MUP, MUED264, PHIL, POPC, REL, SPA, WRI). (PHIL, CLAS, MUS, and MUP are recommended to complement your drama studies.)
- j. 6 credits of courses offered by the Departments of Social Sciences or Psychology (CNST, ECO, HIS, INDG, POEC, PSCI, PSY, SOC). (HIS or PSY are recommended to complement your drama studies.)
- k. 6 credits of courses in the Faculty of Science.

#### **Permissible minors:**

All minors listed in <u>section 10.6</u>, except for Drama and Forensic Studies.

Electives recommended to complement your drama studies include: ARTH, DAN, MUS, MUP, MGT, MARK, REL, ENG 338, 339 and 396, or WRI 391 and 392.
