- q. 6 credits of courses offered by the Departments of Social Sciences or Psychology (CNST, ECO, HIS, INDG, POEC, PSCI, PSY, SOC).
- r. 6 credits of courses in the Faculty of Science.

Permissible minors:

All minors listed in [section 10.6](#), except for Music and Forensic Studies.

Students with a major in Music must complete a minimum of 12 credits of MUS or MUP at Concordia University of Edmonton.

Electives recommended to complement your music studies include: MUED 213, MUED 214, MUED 264, PSY 104, DRA 252, DRA 149, BUS 110, BUS 201, LDR 301, PHY 175, REL 101, REL 150, REL 248, REL 252, UFDN 199, HIS 207, HIS 212 or HIS 261
