Good afternoon dear guests, partners, colleagues, ladies and gentlemen,

7 years ago Concordia University of Edmonton made a first trip to China searching to establish linkages. I was well received and we got four partnerships with universities in Southern China and Hong Kong. This was the beginning of our institutional outreach to China. Then I met Dr. Xinxin Fang and was connected to the Confucius Institute in Edmonton with whom we partnered too for cultural exchanges. Three and a half years ago, Xinxin had already been hired to join our team, we established the unique Centre for Chinese Studies at Concordia, in a partnership with Hanban directly and the CIE. We naturally nominated Dr. Fang for the directorship. In September 2018 the CCS moved in to our new building. In the meanwhile, the Centre had been growing and bringing initiatives in areas of teacher development, Chinese language and culture and society.

Also in the meanwhile we have 9 university partners from Beijing to Shandong, Shanghai, Chongqing, Guangdong and Hong Kong, and one first, prestigious Dual Degrees program in Beijing in Management.

It is a great pleasure and honour to see this day today and what we are doing here: a significant partnership between our CCS and the Edmonton Public Schools. Edmonton Public Schools offers the most variety of language arts programs, and language and culture programs in north America. The MOU we are signing today with the Institute for Innovation in Second Language Education at Edmonton Public Schools fits in not only with our Centre's vision and activities but also with the interdisciplinary Research Cluster on linguistics and Language education, that Dr. Fang also chairs at Concordia.

With this agreement yet another new era opens for Concordia and Edmonton in terms of fostering innovation in language education and from our part, especially from my vice presidency's areas, we will do all efforts necessary and possible to have this project flourish. Last but not least, we are very proud of our friendship with China and the Chinese people. We look forward to working with IISLE at EPSB closely to support language and culture projects.
