The recipient must have a minimum GPA of 3.5, be registered in 27 credits, and display a significant contribution to Concordia or the community.
<b>Canadian Polish Academic Society Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Canadian Polish Academic Society</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: One	An annual \$1,000 award to an undergraduate student of Polish ancestry. The recipient must demonstrate academic achievement by presenting a minimum 3.0 GPA and be registered in a full-course load (15 credits) in an undergraduate degree program. Applicants must submit proof of ancestry.
<b>Carolyn B. McNeil Fine Arts Bursary</b> <i>Donor: A. Stirling McNeil and family</i>	Value: \$ variable Number: One	Awarded to a student who has demonstrated commitment to leadership through involvement in the arts, athletics, and/or volunteer activity in campus life or the community. The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need. The recipient must also intend to register full-time in the subsequent year of study.
<b>Concordia Leadership Award</b> <i>Donor: Concordia University of Edmonton faculty and staff, and the Government of Alberta</i>	Value: \$600 Number: Two	Awarded to students who display outstanding leadership qualities and who have made a significant contribution to campus life and/or the community. The recipients must be registered in a minimum of 24 credits, present a minimum GPA of 3.0, and demonstrate financial need.
<b>Concordia Students' Association Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Concordia Students' Association</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: One	Awarded to an undergraduate student who has participated in student activities (e.g. student clubs and associations, athletics) and has had a significant and positive impact on campus life. The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 3.0.
<b>Concordia UCEP Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Concordia University of Edmonton faculty, staff and students, and the Government of Alberta</i>	Value: \$500 Number: One	Awarded to a Concordia UCEP graduate who is enrolled in an Arts, Management, or Science degree program. The recipient must be registered in 24 credits, present a minimum GPA of 2.7, demonstrate financial need, and have made a contribution to campus life and/or the community.
<b>Concordia University of Edmonton Staff Association Award</b> <i>Donor: Concordia Staff Association and the Government of Alberta</i>	Value: \$500 Number: One	Awarded to a student who is a dependent of a member of the Concordia Staff Association, is registered in a minimum of 24 credits at the university level, has maintained a minimum GPA of 2.3 and demonstrates financial need. The recipient must display leadership abilities and be active in campus life or the community.

<b>Concordia University of Edmonton Thunder Hockey Alumni Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Thunder Hockey Alumni Association</i>	Value: \$500 Number: Two	Two annual \$500 awards to members of Concordia's Thunder Hockey team enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. Recipients must have completed a minimum 24 credits, be registered in 80% of a full-course load, present a minimum GPA of 2.5 and demonstrate aspects of perseverance, sportsmanship and dedication to the Hockey Program. Applicants will write about their experiences, leadership and community service in their application essay.
<b>Constable Peter Schiemann Memorial Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Family and Friends of Cst. Peter Schiemann</i>	Value: \$ 1,000 Number: Two	Awarded to students who are direct relatives (i.e. sibling, spouse, child, or grandchild) of an active or retired member of the RCMP. The recipient must be enrolled in a university-level program, present a minimum GPA of 2.5, and display a strong character, work ethics, and personal faith. Applicants for this award must include three reference forms, one each from a member of the RCMP, a current or former professor or teacher, and their pastor.
<b>CSA Mental Health Champion Award</b> <i>Donor: Concordia Students' Association</i>	Value: \$ 1,000 Number: One	Awarded to an undergraduate student who is an advocate for mental health and wellness on campus or in the community. The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 2.7, be registered full-time (minimum 60% of a full-course load) and demonstrate significant involvement in mental health and wellness initiatives.
<b>Davison Rotary Bursary</b> <i>Donor: Rotary Club of Edmonton Northeast</i>	Value: variable Number: One	Awarded to a student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. The recipient must be registered full-time, present a minimum satisfactory academic standing for their program of study, demonstrate a commitment to physical activity through enrolment in physical activity courses (e.g. DAN, PACT, PAT, or PESS courses) or participation on a Thunder Athletic team, and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to students who live in northeast Edmonton and volunteer in their community.
<b>Derek Persson Memorial Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Family and friends of Derek Persson</i>	Value: \$ variable Number: One	Awarded to a full-time Concordia student who presents a minimum GPA of 2.3 and who participates in Music department activities and/or courses. The recipient should display strong musical ability and have made a positive contribution to the life and spirit of Concordia and its community.
<b>Edmonton Glenora Rotary Club Bursary</b> <i>Donor: Edmonton Glenora Rotary Club</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: One	Awarded to a student enrolled in an Arts, management, or Science degree program. The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 2.7, contribute to volunteer service in campus life and/or community, and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to a single-parent mother who is seeking entry or re-entry into the labour market.
<b>Edmonton Oil Kings Jr. Hockey Club Award</b>	Value: \$1,000 Number: Five	Awarded to members of the Concordia University of Edmonton men's Thunder Hockey Team who are enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. In addition to the normal

<b>Edmonton Rotary Club Bursary</b> <i>Donor: Edmonton Rotary Club Foundation</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: Two	Awarded to students who contribute to the life of the institution or community. The recipients must demonstrate academic achievement and financial need.
<b>Gerhardt W. Hyatt Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Chaplains of the United States Army</i>	Value: \$ variable Number: One	Awarded to a student with a minimum GPA of 3.0 who is registered in 30 credits and demonstrates financial need. The recipient must participate in extracurricular activities (e.g., Christian Life Committee, Drama, Sports, Student Council, and Music), display leadership ability, and have a professional career goal.
<b>Maple Leaf Athletic Club Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Maple Leaf Athletic Club Alumni Association</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: One	Annual \$1,000 award to a full-time student enrolled in an undergraduate degree program. The recipient must be registered in a minimum 60% of a full-course load, present a minimum GPA of 2.0., and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to entrance students within the Concordia Thunder Hockey Program and if no eligible applicant is found, it may be awarded to a continuing student with demonstrated financial need.
<b>Math Kangaroo Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Friends of the Math Kangaroo Program</i>	Value: \$500 Number: One	An annual \$500 award to an undergraduate student who has made a significant contribution to math education in the Edmonton community and surrounding area. The recipient must present a minimum 3.0 GPA. Preference will be given to volunteers or past participants in the Math Kangaroo program.
<b>Northlands Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Northlands</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: One	Awarded to an undergraduate student who has demonstrated a commitment to leadership through involvement in the community and/or campus life. The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 3.0 and be registered in a minimum 80% of a full-course load (12 credits) per semester in both the qualifying and award years.
<b>Peter Balback Memorial Bursary</b> <i>Donor: The family of Peter Balback</i>	Value: \$500 Number: One	Awarded to students who display Christian commitment and service, and who have active membership in a church congregation. The recipients must present a minimum GPA of 2.3 and demonstrate financial need. Preference will be given to students who are members of a Lutheran Church-Canada congregation.
<b>Ron Floden Flying Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Anonymous</i>	Value: \$2,000 Number: One	Awarded to a student pursuing a career in aviation who is either currently enrolled in training for or has attained multi-engine certification. The recipient must demonstrate strong scholastic achievement and community involvement. In years where a suitable candidate is not found, the scholarship shall

		be awarded to students in the faculty of Arts or Science who are registered in a minimum of 24 credits, achieved a minimum GPA of 3.0 and demonstrate financial need.
<b>The Rotary Club of Edmonton Northeast Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Rotary Club of Edmonton Northeast</i>	Value: \$1,000 Number: One	Awarded to a graduate of M.E. Lazerte Composite High School, Archbishop O’Leary Catholic High School, or Eastglen Composite High School who is enrolled in their first or second year of study in a Bachelor of Arts or Science degree program. The recipient must be registered in at least 24 credits, present a minimum GPA of 2.3, be committed to volunteer service in campus life and/or the community, demonstrate financial need, and intend to return to Concordia in the subsequent year of study.
<b>Sid and Nellie Braaksma Scholarship</b> <i>Donor: Concordia University of Edmonton</i>	Value: \$2,400 Number: One	Awarded to an undergraduate student who demonstrates a commitment to community service through volunteerism in their community. The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 3.0 and be registered in a minimum 80% of a full-course load (12 credits) per semester. Preference will be given to the student who demonstrates the highest aggregate quantity of community service.

The recipient must present a minimum GPA of 3.0, be registered in a minimum of 24 credits, and demonstrate financial need.
