

If this program seems unique, that's because it is. It is **one of only six programs in Canada** that can train you to be an **Environment Health (EH) Officer** or **Public Health Inspector.** Environmental health is the practice of protecting public health by applying relevant provincial legislation and providing support to mitigate the physical, chemical, and biological risks found in natural and man-made environments.

Environmental Health Officers work in diverse settings across the public, private, and not-for-profit sectors, as well as for educational institutions and research organizations, educational institutions and as consultants.

Students in the program who choose to take a 12-week field placement practicum can take the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (CIPHI) certification exam to be able to practice as an Public Health Inspector in Canada.

JUMP START


Jump Start allows students in Grade 11 to apply to CUE with their Grade 11 grades. Students interested in applying early may do so from January 1 - June 15 of their Grade 11 year. Arts and Science applicants must show an overall average of 65% in their Grade 11 courses and Management and Dual Degrees applicants must show an overall average of 72%. Final admission is dependent on students completing their relevant Grade 12 courses and achieving minimum entrance averages for the program they have applied.

ACCEPTANCE OF AP/IB COURSES

We recognize students who complete their Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses and exams. Students who receive a grade of 4 or 5 on the AP exams and 5 or higher on IB exams may be assessed for transfer credits towards courses at CUE.
