



SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

for Bachelor of Environmental Health
After Degree Students

ROB AND URSULA O'NEILL SCHOLARSHIP IN ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH (online application)

An annual \$1,000 award to a student entering the Bachelor of Environmental Health (After Degree) program. The award will be presented to an applicant demonstrating leadership and community service. The online application, available through Online Services for Students/Requests is available September 1. The deadline to apply is September 30th.

CUE SCHOLARSHIPS (online application)

This annual competition includes numerous donor-funded scholarships for students who demonstrate scholastic achievement, volunteer/community service, leadership qualities, and/or financial need. Some awards are program-specific. The online application, available through Online Services for Students/Requests, opens in November and closes January 15th. A reference letter is required to complete the application. Cash awards are presented annually in winter term.

CONCORDIA ACADEMIC AWARDS (no application required)

Annual awards (\$750) in each undergraduate Faculty – Arts, Education, Management and Science. One award per concentration (3-year degree program) and one award per major (4-year degree program) will be awarded. Recipients must be in the final year of their program and have achieved the highest cumulative grade point average in their program of study.

MÉTIS SCHOLAR AWARDS (online application)

A \$2,500 bursary to help alleviate the cost of tuition and learning resources and to encourage the post-secondary achievement of full-time Métis undergraduate students while attending Concordia University of Edmonton. Recipients must be enrolled full-time in any year of an undergraduate degree program at Concordia University of Edmonton and display academic merit. Preference will be given to those who are not receiving the Indigenous Careers Award and who demonstrate financial need.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS THROUGH ALBERTA STUDENT AID (application required)

The Alberta Government through Alberta Student Aid, and in partnership with post-secondary institutions and other community organizations, offers a suite of scholarships and awards to encourage and reward the excellence of Alberta students. Indigenous Careers Award

The Indigenous Careers Award is an award designed to increase access and participation of Alberta Indigenous post-secondary students and encourage them to continue and complete their studies. The award is made possible through Government of Alberta funding. Value: \$4000 (\$2000/semester).

Jason Lang Scholarship

An annual \$1,000 award to students who display outstanding academic achievement. Recipients must have completed a minimum of 80% of a full-course load and achieved a minimum Session GPA of 3.2 in their qualifying year. Recipients must also be Alberta residents and continuing full-time in the second or subsequent year of their undergraduate program at a recognized post-secondary institution in Alberta. Concordia's Financial Aid and Awards office will identify eligible students after the end of winter session and invite them to apply.

Laurence Decore Awards for Student Leadership

Four annual \$1,000 awards to undergraduate students who have demonstrated commitment and leadership in student government, student societies, clubs or organizations, student organizations at the provincial or national level, or non-profit community organizations. Recipients must have been enrolled full-time in the current academic year and be a resident of Alberta.

Dr. Gary McPherson Leadership Scholarship

Two annual \$2,000 awards to students (undergraduate or graduate) who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, especially in the area of disability, and/or initiative to improve the conditions and lives of all people, while attending post-secondary studies in Alberta. The recipient must have been enrolled full-time in the current academic year and be living in Alberta. This award is open to non-Albertans who are living in the province to attend university.

CONCORDIA STUDENT OF THE YEAR AWARD (application required)

A \$2000 award to an undergraduate student who demonstrates outstanding leadership in extra-curricular campus activities (e.g. CSA, athletics, club and unions, drama, residence, etc.). The recipient demonstrates integrity, respect, and a servant's heart in their interactions with fellow students, faculty and staff. The recipient has also made a significant positive impact on student life through their entire career at Concordia University of Edmonton. The recipient must be registered full-time in the Fall and Winter of the current academic year and convocate in May. Concordia Students' Association executives are not eligible to receive this award. Donor: Concordia Students' Association.

CONCORDIA BURSARY PROGRAM (online application)

The bursary assistance program provides non-repayable forms of financial assistance to domestic and international students on the basis of financial need and is intended to assist students who, in spite of their own best efforts, are experiencing difficulties in meeting tuition and other reasonable educational expenses while attending Concordia University of Edmonton. The program consists of general bursary dollars as well as some privately donated bursaries. The bursaries listed below are for Bachelor of Environmental Health students, but you may qualify for other donor funded bursaries and institutional bursaries. The online bursary application is available through Online Services for Students/Requests. The fall term deadline is October 15th and the winter term deadline is February 1st. Students may apply only once in an academic year. To be considered for the bursaries listed below students should submit a fall term application.
