

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic the maximum amount of Canada Student Grants will be doubled for the 2020-2021 academic year. The Canada Student Grant for Full-Time Students will increase up to a maximum of \$6,000 and the grant for part-time studies to \$3,600. Popular Music (MUS 103) is 3 credit fine arts offering, open to all students at CUE.


Handbell Ensemble (MUPE X64)
