

Too Much Zoom Makes Us All Go Blind





2021 TED ROGERS MANAGEMENT CONFERENCE

The Ted Rogers Management Conference (TRMC) is organized by a team at the Ted Rogers School of Management at Ryerson University in Toronto. It is one of the most prestigious undergraduate student conferences in North America and typically takes place in Toronto during the month of March. In 2021, however, TRMC will be taking place **virtually (online)** from **March 4th - 6th, 2021!**

At the conference, the world's brightest undergraduate students and many high-profile professionals come together for 3 days of workshops, networking, keynote speaker events, a case competition, and other exciting activities!

Undergraduate students from all faculties are welcome to apply regardless of their program of study as long as they will be **at least 19 years of age at the time of the conference.**

Delegate applications are open until November 30th, 2020 for Canadian delegates, and until **January 10th, 2021 for international delegates**, through the following link: <https://ryersontrmc.ca/apply/>

When applying, it will ask you to indicate an External Campus Ambassador referee in the drop-down menu. Select "**Christian Potolicki**", who is CUE's External Campus Ambassador for TRMC 2021.

There are a limited number of delegate positions available for the conference, and all applications will be evaluated through a blind application process to remove any biases in delegate selection. The quality of your application will be the only thing that the 3rd party application reviewers will be considering, not who you know or your school.

If you are successful in your application for a delegate position, the cost for the conference will be about **\$45 CAD for students attending Canadian universities**, and **\$25 USD for students attending international universities outside of Canada.**

It is rumoured that the delegate packages TRMC is preparing for domestic delegates will surpass this dollar amount in terms of value, so the conference will definitely be worth it in that sense, never mind the unique activities and networking opportunities involved in the conference itself!

Applying is FREE, and if you are a successful applicant but change your mind about attending the conference later on, **acceptance can be declined without penalty!**

Partial reimbursement of the conference fee may also be available through the CSA. 

Do you use Google Scholar for your research? Here's how to get more full-text access to articles and other resources from CUE Library through this popular platform.

1. Access the internet by using Google Chrome
2. Visit Google Scholar
3. If you are not signed into Google, click "Sign In"
4. Click the three line menu bar
5. Select "Settings"
6. Click "Library Links"
7. Search for "Concordia University of Edmonton" and click the search button
8. Check both resulting boxes
9. Click save

Once you have done this, you will have more access to full-text articles from CUE Library through Google Scholar.



Bielefeld is a medium sized city in northwestern Germany, a region with an industrial focus, in which business and science are closely connected. The Bielefeld School of Education (BiSEd) is responsible for teacher education at Bielefeld University and is thus in close contact with schools in the area. Bielefeld University is a young innovative research university with 25.000 students and more than 2.700 employees in Northwest Germany. This modern location for top-level research and education abides by the principle of excellent cross-disciplinary research and teaching.

The internship will take place in a German school to prepare the intern for his/her work life. There are primary schools (grades 1-4, approx. age 6-10) and secondary schools (grades 5-12/13, approx. age 11-18).
