

The survey is being administered by CUE's International Office, and CUE's Office of Institutional Research and Program Development (IRPD).





The program will provide more opportunities for under-represented Albertans to apply their talents in a wide range of pursuits – from science, technology and trades to the arts – helping to build the workforce of the future in Alberta.

Value: \$2500

Who can apply?

- students registered (full or part-time) in an undergraduate or graduate program at an approved Alberta post-secondary institution
- students who are residents of Alberta and are a Canadian citizen, Permanent Resident or Protected Person (visa students are not eligible)
- Indigenous students, racialized students and students living with a disability are strongly encouraged to apply
- Students of any gender

The Leaders in Equality Award of Distinction (LEAD) Program is now accepting applications from students eager to make a difference in their communities.

The scholarship program consists of two funding streams:

- 1. **Women in STEM Award stream** open to women under 30 years of age pursuing studies in science, technology, engineering and mathematics, and
