Call for Scholarship Applicants: Dave Donley Memorial Scholarship

The family of former Tetra Tech employee Dave Donley, Jr., has established a memorial scholarship for Canadian post-secondary information technology (IT) and computer studies students.

The Dave Donley Memorial Scholarship is accepting applications through April 30, 2021.

Dave was a valued member of Tetra Tech's IT team from 2010 until his death in 2016 at age 32. Dave's family wishes to honor his legacy by

supporting students who exhibit the same qualities that Dave was known for—a passion for technology, strong problem solving and creative thinking abilities, and enthusiasm for helping others.



Dave was known on Tetra Tech's IT team for his ability to solve even the most challenging problems, working on network support, configuration, and performance improvement and design and management of backup and daily IT operations. "You literally had to point him in the direction of a problem, and no matter how complex it was, he could solve it," one colleague said. Another characterized him as "a leader of the best sort... [who] motivated his team by his enthusiasm, commitment, and energy."

The Dave Donley Memorial Scholarship is open to all Canadian post-secondary students who have been accepted to or are attending a post-secondary institution in Canada in an IT or computer studies program. Students can be enrolled in any year of study at a university, college, or technical school. Tetra Tech employees and their children in Canada are eligible to apply, but affiliation with Tetra Tech is not required.

Dr. Marcella Siqueira Cassiano is a Lecturer in Sociology at the Concordia University of Edmonton and the University of Alberta. Marcella holds a PhD in Sociology from the University of Alberta and a master's degree from Shandong University in China. Her research projects focus on population governance, particularly the policies, practices, and technologies that manufacture social conformity and regulate populations in the contexts of work and migration.

In her talk, Marcella will discuss China's Household Register and demonstrate how state actors have equipped this Register with artificial intelligence to regulate people's lives on and off the Internet.

First Nation, Métis and Inuit Bursary

Value: \$6,000 - \$10,000

Application Deadline: June 1, 2021

The First Nation, Métis and Inuit (FNMI) NADC Bursary program provides funding for students in the form of a non-repayable bursary if you agree to live and work in the north for one year of full-time employment in return for each year of bursary support received. Students must apply for the bursary for each year they want to be considered. The goal of this bursary is to assist FNMI students to obtain the skills and knowledge to enter or re-enter the workforce in northern Alberta. Students in pre-apprenticeship training, or in a certificate or diploma studies can access up to \$6,000 for their studies. Students in a Bachelor's, Masters' or PhD program can access \$10,000 per year for any year of their studies.

Mattinson Scholarship Program for Students with Disabilities

Value: \$2000

Application Deadline: April 15, 2021

The Mattinson Scholarship Program for Students with Disabilities was created to encourage Canadian students with permanent disabilities to pursue university studies with the ultimate objective of obtaining a first undergraduate degree. Each year, Concordia University of Edmonton holds an internal competition to identify the best nominee to put forward to the national competition. Applicants must be enrolled in their second or third standing year of studies during the upcoming academic year and have a minimum cumulative average of 80% (or equivalent) over the last three terms of available marks.

This scholarship program is administered by Scholarship Partners Canada (SPC), a division of Universities Canada.

Repaying Your Student Loans

Repayment is the process of returning the money you have borrowed to the student loan lenders, which includes the principal amount of the loan plus interest.

When does repayment begin?

Repayment begins when you graduate or leave school for more than six months or are no longer a full-time student.



6-Month Non-Repayment Period: After you leave school, a six-month non-repayment period starts. During this period, you are not required to make any payments. You can, however, choose to make payments during this period. After the 6-month period ends, you will start repayment.

What am I responsible for?



You are responsible for repaying your loan & associated interest according to the terms of your loan agreement, and notifying your student loan provider if you:

Change your name, address, banking information, or phone number

Change from full-time to part-time studies or vice versa

Leave or transfer to another school

Create an online account with your student loan lender/s! This allows you the flexibility to access your student loan information at your convenience and update your contact information. It also gives you access to important communications and documents.

It is very important that when you go into repayment you make your full loan payment on time each month.



If you don't, you could end up in default, which has serious consequences and your credit rating may be affected. Student loans are real loans—just as real as car loans or mortgages. You have to pay back your student loans.

Tip: You can make “extra” payments towards your loan debt at any time!

Spring 1 May 3 to 20

DRA 101 (3) Introduction to Theatre Vern Thiessen M to F - 9 to 12 - The World of Theatre and selective histories; the role of theatre spaces; directors, designers and actors in today's theatre; how theatre can enrich our lives. This is a lecture course; no acting required.

DRA 252 (3) Fundamentals of Public Speaking Mike Peng M to F 9–12 Basic techniques of oral communication and public speaking with an emphasis on speech construction and delivery. Prereq: 2nd year standing required.

MUS 100 (3) Rudiments of Music* Deborah Rice M to F 9–12 Fundamentals of music theory approached through aural and written training, including an understanding of intervals. For beginners as well as music students with a weak background in theory.

Spring 2 May 25 to June 10

DRA 102 (3) Play Analysis Glenda Stirling M to F 9-12 Reading and critiquing a variety of play scripts. This leads to applying creative solutions to the problems surrounding the live production of these plays. The class observes selections from filmed performances of the plays studied. No acting required. May include some in person classes.

MUS 120 (3) Advanced Rudiments of Music* Danielle Lisboa M to F 9 –12 Advanced fundamentals of music theory including intervals, chords, scales, compound meters, and key signatures along with musicianship training in rhythmic and melodic sight-singing, and music dictation and writing in pentatonic and diatonic modes. Prepares Music majors and minors to continue with MUS 211 in the Fall semester. Prereq: MUS 100 [min. C- grade required]. Some in person classes.

DAN 340 (3) Modern Dance Jodie Vandekerkhove TR 12:30–3:45 Introduction to the study of creative dance techniques, improvisation, composition, and performance through theory and practical experience. In person.

MUPX X22 Applied Music, Novice/Secondary Area (individual studio classes) **MUPX X26 Applied Music, Primary Area** (individual studio classes) (1.5) Private music lessons in the student's performance area, as either novice or secondary performance area. Some in person classes.

Summer 2 August 3 to 19

DRA 252 (3) Fundamentals of Public Speaking Michele Fleiger M to F 9–12 Basic techniques of oral communication and public speaking with an emphasis on speech construction and delivery. Prereq: 2nd year standing required.

Summer 1 & 2 July 20 to August 19

DRA 149 Introduction to Creative Process Dave Horak M to F 9 – 12 Exploring speech, movement, and improvisation through acting, ensemble work, and theatre games, and participation in self-created dramas of different forms. This is a practical, performance based class. Some in person classes.
