Education costs will vary depending on your degree program and your actual course registration but listed below are some estimates of what you can expect.



Pay My Tuition – Your tuition is due on the first day of class each term. One month before classes begin, you can view your personal statement of account in Online Services for Students.

Be Prepared – Before putting your nose to the books, take time to make a budget for the upcoming academic year. Just like studying for exams, being financially prepared sets you up for success!

#### UNIVERSITY ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship is awarded to high school students (Canadian and International) entering their first year of post-secondary study in Arts, Management, or Science with a 75% or higher awards average. This scholarship is renewable for four years, or until the completion of your first degree. Automatic consideration is given to those who apply for Fall admission by April 1st; Winter admission by August 1st.

Award Average	Scholarship Value	Annual Value Over 4 Years
95.0 or higher	\$5,000	Maximum \$20,000
90.0 - 94.9	\$3,750	Maximum \$15,000
85.0 – 89.9	\$2,000	Maximum \$8,000
80.0 - 84.9	\$1,500	Maximum \$6,000
75.0 – 79.9	\$1,000	Maximum \$4,000

#### UNIVERSITY TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIP

Students who transfer to Concordia University of Edmonton with a minimum 24 university-level transferable credits may be eligible for a one-time \$1,500 scholarship. Students must present a minimum 3.5 or higher admission GPA and be working toward the completion of their first baccalaureate degree program. Automatic consideration for those who apply for admission by June 1st.

The federal and provincial/territorial government student financial assistance programs offer interest free loans and grants to Canadian citizens, permanent residents and protected persons. Students apply for assistance through their province or territory of residence. It's worthwhile to apply early so that your funding is in place before fee payment deadlines.

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

- There are federal grants for students with permanent disabilities.
  Contact Concordia's Learning Accommodation Services to book an appointment to explore your learning supports.
- You do not have to make any payments toward your government student loans as long as you are a full-time student currently receiving loans or you have completed an interest-free status form
- Grants and bursaries do not normally have to be paid back.
- You can apply for a student loan even before you are registered in classes.

CUE's Financial Aid Advisors can advise and assist you through the government student loan application process. Attend one of our summer Student Loan Workshops or book an individual advising session.
