Program Overview

3-year BA: This program is designed to give you a broad understanding of the foundational principles of the French language. With a pedagogy oriented towards a communicative approach and task-based activities, you will discover the richness and diversity of the French and Francophone cultures. Our growing international programs also offer you the option to study in a Francophone country.

3-year BA Dual Degree: We now also offer an International Double Degree. You can begin your 3-year degree at Concordia University of Edmonton and complete the final year at Université de Bretagne – Sud in France. You'll earn both a Bachelor of Arts (French) from Concordia University of Edmonton and a Licence Lettres Modernes from Université de Bretagne – Sud!

Career Options

Admission Requirements

Interested? You'll need to present a 60% average, with a passing grade in the following required high school courses:

- English Language Arts 30-1
- Three subjects from Groups A, B or C*
- One subject from Group A, B, C or D

* Maximum of two subjects from Group B, each must be distinct.

Interesting Courses

FR372 - French Phonetics: Improve your ability to speak the French language with an introduction to French phonetics focusing on the recognition and elimination of pronunciation difficulties for English speakers. May be of special interest for students wanting to go into early childhood education, or those wishing to better their speaking skills in the French language.

FR380 - Contemporary French and Francophone Culture: Texts, Films and Sounds: This course aims to offer students a solid introduction to French and Francophone culture and civilization through the lens of three different mediums. The course content includes representative texts, authors, films and music from French and Francophone countries: France, North Africa and Sub-Saharan Africa, the Caribbean area and Quebec.

FR390 - Introduction to Children's Literature in French: A critical and historical survey of children's literature from France and other francophone countries. The reading of works of literature is accompanied by the viewing of relevant audiovisual materials such as films and videos. A valuable course for students wishing to pursue a career in education!
