Interested? You'll need to present a 60% average, with a passing grade in the following required high school courses:

- English Language Arts 30-1
- Three subjects from Groups A, B or C\*
- One subject from Group A, B, C or D

\* *Maximum of two subjects from Group B, each must be distinct.*

## Interesting Courses

*PHIL 260 - Philosophy of Human Nature:* Tackle the most important theories of human nature found in the histories of philosophy, theology, psychology, and biology by analyzing the works of authors such as Plato, Aristotle, Mencius, Biblical authors, Augustine, Seneca, Aquinas, Descartes, Hume, Marx, Nietzsche, Freud, Sartre, Beauvoir, Skinner, Lorenz, and Wilson.

*PHIL 282 - Free Will and Determinism:* Is free will an illusion? Is determinism founded upon fallacy? These two questions will guide your investigation of the debate between libertarians and determinists. Key terms will be defined and the main views on both sides of the debate will be explained as we try to ascertain which side, if either, has the stronger arguments in its favour.
