## MUSIC

## PHILOSOPHY

Hone your ability to think beyond the ordinary, develop and refine exceptional reasoning and critical thinking skills, and effectively communicate complex ideas through the study of knowledge, truth, ethics and the nature of existence.

## POLITICAL ECONOMY

Study the interaction of politics and economics to analyze the major domestic and international challenges facing Canada and the world today. Excellent training for careers in politics, law, business and the not-for-profit sector.

## PSYCHOLOGY

Delve into the human mind and its relation to learning, behavior, personality and memory, as you develop your research, communication and analytical assessment skills.

## PSYCHOLOGY (APPLIED EMPHASIS)

Get practical, applied and research experience in the field by working at a community agency or organization over the course of your final year. Note: First year psychology students cannot apply for the Applied Emphasis program but can plan their course sequence accordingly.

## RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Take a deeper look at the human condition, examine the meaning of life through the lens of significant eras and cultures, and understand how religion has altered societies and civilizations.

## SOCIOLOGY

Gain the skills to critically understand one's own social location, how social forces shape our lives, and the sources and consequences of inequality.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for admission, applicants must present a minimum admission average of $60 \%$ with a passing grade in each of the the following high school course requirements:

## English Language Arts 30-1

Four subjects from Group A, B, C, D*
Admissions to the Bachelor of Arts Degree program is competitive; meeting the minimum admission average requirement does not guarantee admission to the program.

Note: In order to maximize future program and course choices, applicants are encouraged to present a broad range of subjects across Groups A, B and C.
*Applicants should keep in mind that their chosen program including major, minor or concentration may contain courses for which there are specific grade 12 prerequisites that must be met in addition to the subjects used for admission.
