## **POLITICAL ECONOMY**

## **PSYCHOLOGY**

Delve into the human mind and its relation to learning, behavior, personality and memory, as you develop your research, communication and analytical assessment skills.

### **PSYCHOLOGY (APPLIED EMPHASIS)**

Get practical, applied and research experience in the field by working at a community agency or organization over the course of your final year. Note: First year psychology students cannot apply for the Applied Emphasis program but can plan their course sequence accordingly.

# ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for admission, applicants must present a minimum admission average of 60% with a passing grade in each of the the following high school course requirements:

## English Language Arts 30-1

### Four subjects from Group A, B, C, D\*

Admissions to the Bachelor of Arts Degree program is competitive; meeting the minimum admission average requirement does not guarantee admission to the program.

**Note:** In order to maximize future program and course choices, applicants are encouraged to present a broad range of subjects across Groups A, B and C.

\*Applicants should keep in mind that their chosen program including major, minor or concentration may contain courses for which there are specific grade 12 prerequisites that must be met in addition to the subjects used for admission.
