## **Concentration Requirements**

## 24-30 credits required, to include:

- a. HIS 111 or 112
- b. HIS 290
- c. One of HIS 260, 261, 365, 366, 368, 369 or 370
- d. One of HIS 207, 208, 212, 213, 218, 309, 315, 333, or 340
- e. One of HIS 206, 221, 250, 251, 300-series (301, 302, or 303), 355, 415, 416 or 464
- f. HIS 410
- g. 6-12 credits chosen from:
  - INDG 340, or
  - unspecified senior-level HIS courses.

Students with a concentration in History must complete a minimum of 12 credits at the 300- or 400-level in this concentration.

### In addition to the above, students must complete:

- h. 3 credits of junior-level ENG courses.
- 3 additional credits in courses offered by the departments of Fine Arts, Philosophy and Religious studies, or Literature and Languages (ARAB, ARTH, CHIN, CLAS, CLIT, CREE, DAN, DRA, ENG, FR, GERM, GRK, HEBR, LAT, MUS, MUP, MUPB, MUPE, MUPH, MUPK, MUPP, MUPS, MUPV, MUPW, MUED264, PHIL, POPC, REL, SPA, WRI).
- j. 6 credits of courses offered by the Faculty of Science.

All minors listed in section 10.6, other than History and Forensic Studies.
