

CATALYTIC CONVERTER THEFTS

Concordia security received reports of a catalytic converter thefts in the area.

Expo Security patrols the Z lot, their phone number is 780-471-7222, the Edmonton Police Service 780 423-4567 is also aware of crime in this area and has been patrolling and Concordia security is looking at ways to improve security for the parking lot.

REMINDER TO EXPO "Z" PASS HOLDERS

Due to the recent thefts of vehicle catalytic converters at the Expo Centre and adjacent lots; we want to remind Expo Z passe holders those passes are valid in the main Concordia lots between 6:00 PM and 6:00 AM. Monday through Friday and all day Saturday and Sunday.



Metal scrap yards have been advised that if they receive catalytic converters with VINs on them, they are most likely stolen and to call police.

There are a few other things people can do.

- Install an anti-theft device (eg: steel shield covering the catalytic converter; a cage made out of rebar; stainless steel cables welded from the converter to the vehicle frame)
- Paint it using high-temperature paint (eg: BBQ spray paint) and inscribe the VIN on it.
- Set the vehicle alarm to detect vibration.
