

Scholarship at the Doctoral School

- ☐ Admission fee (250 PLN) for the doctoral school is non-refundable

Doctoral students can take part in various mobility programmes, such as:

- □ PROM programme financial support for scholarship exchange of PhD candidates and academic staff (active participation in a conference or obtaining materials for a PhD thesis/a library query in an institution abroad)
- ☐ Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange different research programmes, short and long term

Don and Norine Lowry Awards for Women of Excellence

Don Lowry was the president and CEO of EPCOR from January 1998 to his retirement on March 6th of 2013. In recognition of his service, EPCOR's Board of Directors established a fund with the support of other community members. Don and Norine matched EPCOR's contribution to the Don and Norine Lowry Awards Fund. The award is to honour Don and his achievements for the company and community. More importantly, it provides assistance to women of all ages in pursuit of their goals.



Each year typically 5 students receive awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$5,000. The size and number of awards may vary.

Don and Norine Lowry Awards Criteria

- You are a woman
- You are a resident of the City of Edmonton. Surrounding municipalities are not eligible.
- You are a Canadian Citizen or permanent resident.
- You are pursuing a program of study in one of the following fields: Engineering, Medicine,
 Dentistry, Nursing, water, power, energy, finance, accounting, and safety.

PROGRAM CONTENT

Global Players and Hidden Champions: Business and Technology Made in Germany

The Summer University Lingen (SUL) offers a unique insight into Germany's economy and its successful internationally operating companies. You will have the chance to experience German economy at first hand by participating in exciting lectures by our dedicated professors and by visiting several companies . A great way to network and to receive access to the German labor market!

The backbone of Germany's economy are family-owned medium-sized companies, the so-called German Mittelstand, which not only have high revenues but are also often huge players on the global market. The area of Lingen, where our Summer University takes place, is home to many Mittelstand companies. They have strong ties to the region while at the same time operating very successfully on an international and global market. The Summer University Lingen (SUL) will analyze the following questions:

- What is the structure of German economy and what are the challenges?
- · What is the German Mittelstand?
- What are the key success factors of family-owned and medium-sized companies? How did they become internationally successful?

You will attend lectures on topics such as

- Features of small and medium-sized enterprises (SME)
- International Management and International Marketing
- International Human Resource Management
- · Technology based SME

Besides the lectures, you will participate in group and project work as well as deal with case studies.

CREDIT POINTS AND EXAMS

Our university offers 5 ECTS credit points for attending the SUL. The 5 ECTS are awarded for attendance of the lectures and the company visits as well as for the final exam. You will also receive a certificate of attendance.

HOUSING

You can choose between two housing options:

Option 1: Shared student apartment

You will be accommodated with other German or international students in student apartments near the campus. You will have your own bedroom but will usually share a bathroom and a kitchen. The apartments are located throughout the city of Lingen and are not in one building complex.

Option 2: Find your own housing

You can organize housing for yourself in one of the hotels or vacation apartments in Lingen. After your acceptance to the program, you will receive a list of possible hotels. You are responsible for making your own reservations.



Summer University Lingen puts theory into practice!

We will visit several internationally operating companies to gain insight into the regional, international and global procedures of companies in Germany, the city of Lingen and its surrounding area. The companies come from different industries such as automotive engineering, air-conditioning technology, shipbuilding and other innovative technology branches. The company visits are a great opportunity to get a unique insight, talk to company representatives, build a network with potential future employers and find out what they are looking for.
