Your reflection should clearly describe how your experiences, actions, and achievements align with the key criteria: Leadership, Community Service, Professionalism, School and Program Spirit, and Academic Excellence. Include specific examples illustrating how you've embodied these qualities, highlighting your personal growth, meaningful contributions, and positive impact on the school and broader community. Ensure you refer to your application documents.

Starting Point

- How did you view yourself as an educator at the beginning of your program?
- What were your initial strengths and areas for growth?

Key Areas of Growth

- How have your teaching skills evolved?
- How have your interpersonal skills improved?

Challenges and Learning Moments

- What was a key challenge that shaped your growth?
- How did you navigate setbacks, and what did you learn from them?

Shifting Perspectives

- How has your view of education, teaching, or students changed?
- What have you learned about yourself as a future educator?

Ongoing Growth Mindset

- What habits or practices have helped you continue growing?
- How will you continue learning and evolving as an educator?
