General Skill Sets:

The Bachelor of Management program prepares students in foundational business, leadership, communication, and professional skills such as negotiation, team building, team management and people skills (<u>CUE Management</u>). Students develop theoretical knowledge and practical skills, as well as gain experience during the exciting 13-week internship. Students have the option to customize their degree to suit interests and goals by choosing from the following emphasis options: accounting, conflict management, cybersecurity, data management, finance, human resource management, leadership, and marketing.

- Demonstrate ethical decision-making and conduct
- Show self-direction and motivation
- Manage multiple competing priorities and tasks with varying deadline

University graduates are more likely to be promoted or attain leadership positions than those who do not have a degree. Generally, graduates move into positions with increased responsibilities and increased pay, especially once paired with work experience.
