Each year our CUE Financial Aid and Awards Office works with students and their families to help make their CUE education more affordable. We can assist you in navigating through the financial aid process and work with you to identify grants, loans and scholarship opportunities.

WHAT IS A STUDENT LOAN?

A student loan is government funding designed to help students pay for university tuition, books, and living expenses. This financial assistance comes in the form of loans and grants to post-secondary students who demonstrate financial need. Loans are repayable forms of assistance. Grants are non-repayable forms of assistance.

WHAT IS A BURSARY?

A bursary is a non-repayable monetary award based on financial need.

WHAT IS A SCHOLARSHIP?

A scholarship is a non-repayable monetary award based on academic merit and/or non-academic criteria such as community service and leadership.

WHAT IS A STUDENT LINE OF CREDIT?

A line of credit is a loan set up with your banking institution to help cover the cost of tuition, books and living expenses. Contact your banking institution for full details.

CUE SCHOLARSHIPS

(online application)

This annual competition includes numerous donor funded scholarships for students who demonstrate scholastic achievement, volunteer/community service, leadership qualities, and/or financial need. Some awards are program specific. The online application, available through Online Services for Students/ Applications/Award Application, opens in November and closes January 15th. A reference letter is required to complete the application. Cash awards are presented annually in winter term.

ARUN PASSI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP FOR STUDIES IN EDUCATION

(no application required)

A \$5,000 entrance award to a student entering their first year of the Bachelor of Education After Degree program. The recipient must be registered full-time, demonstrate academic excellence and have direct experience with children in formal and informal settings. The recipient will be identified through the admission process.

MÉTIS SCHOLAR AWARD

(online application)

A \$2,500 bursary to help alleviate the cost of tuition and learning resources and to encourage the post-secondary achievement of full-time Métis undergraduate students while attending CUE. Recipients must be enrolled full-time in any year of an undergraduate degree program at CUE and display academic merit. Preference will be given to those who are not receiving the Indigenous Careers Award and who demonstrate financial need. Alberta Métis students are encouraged to visit rupertsland.org for other post-secondary funding opportunities.

WILLIAM & FLORENCE LEDE FAMILY FOUNDATION EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

(no application required)

An annual \$1,000 award to a student who has completed the first year of the Bachelor of Education (After Degree) program. The recipient must have been registered in a full course load (15 credits per semester) in the qualifying year, present a minimum GPA of 3.2, enrol in the second year of the program, and not be receiving other awards totaling more than \$2,000. The scholarship is awarded as a tuition credit. Donor: William and Florence Lede Family Foundation.

Eligible students will be identified in the spring following the release of grades and the scholarship will be awarded to the student presenting the highest GPA who meets all the criteria.

CONCORDIA BURSARY PROGRAM (online application)

The bursary assistance program provides non-repayable forms of financial assistance to domestic and international students on the basis of financial need and is intended to assist students who, in spite of their own best efforts, are experiencing difficulties in meeting tuition and other reasonable educational expenses while attending CUE. The program consists of general bursary dollars as well as some privately donated bursaries. The bursaries listed below are Bachelor of Education-specific bursaries, but you may qualify for other donor funded bursaries and institutional bursaries.

The online bursary application is available through Online Services for Students/Applications/Award Application. The fall term deadline is October 15th and the winter term deadline is February 1st. Students may apply only once in an academic year. To be considered for the bursaries listed below students should submit a fall term application.

CONCORDIA ACADEMIC

AWARDS (no application required)

Annual awards (\$750) in each undergraduate Faculty Arts, Education, Management and Science. One

award per concentration (3-year degree program) and one award per major (4-year degree program) will be awarded. Recipients must be in the final year of their program and have achieved the highest cumulative grade point average in their program of study.

STUDENT OF THE YEAR EDUCATION STUDENTS' SOCIETY (ESS) (application required)

An annual \$1000 award to a Year 2 Bachelor of Education After-Degree student who, over the two years of the program, has best demonstrated a combination of commitment to children and teaching, leadership skills, community service, professionalism, and school & program spirit.

The recipient must present a minimum 2.7 GPA or higher. The intent of the award is to celebrate two years of preservice student excellence.

NORTHERN STUDENT TEACHER BURSARY (NSTB)

The Northern Student Teacher Bursary is a return service bursary that brings teachers to rural and remote northern Alberta locations. Paying \$9,000 per year for up to two years, the bursary is available to students in their last or second last year of a Bachelor of Education degree. It is meant to encourage students to plan to teach in participating northern school divisions upon completion of their degree. The program is administered by Alberta Education in partnership with Jobs, Economy and Northern Development and the Northern Alberta Development Council (NADB).

BRIDGES BURSARY PROGRAM
