Whether you are entering your first year of university or graduating with a degree, we realize financial matters are important to you. Concordia University of Edmonton (CUE) is committed to helping you develop a financial plan so you can realize your academic goals. Each year our CUE Financial Aid and Awards Office works with students and their families to help make their CUE education more affordable. We can assist you in navigating through the financial aid process and work with you to identify grants, loans and scholarship opportunities.

WHAT IS A STUDENT LOAN?

A student loan is government funding designed to help students pay for university tuition, books, and living expenses. This financial assistance comes in the form of loans and grants to post-secondary students who demonstrate financial need. Loans are repayable forms of assistance. Grants are non-repayable forms of assistance.

WHAT IS A BURSARY?

A bursary is a non-repayable monetary award based on financial need.

WHAT IS A SCHOLARSHIP?

A scholarship is a non-repayable monetary award based on academic merit and/or non-academic criteria such as community service and leadership.

WHAT IS A STUDENT LINE OF CREDIT?

A line of credit is a loan set up with your banking institution to help cover the cost of tuition, books and living expenses. Contact your banking institution for full details.

ROB AND URSULA O'NEILL SCHOLARSHIP IN ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH

Awarded to a student entering the Bachelor of Environmental Health (After Degree) program. The award will be presented to an applicant demonstrating leadership and community service. The Google Form is made available September 1 and the deadline to apply is September 30. Value: \$1,000

CUE SCHOLARSHIPS

This annual competition includes numerous donor-funded scholarships for students who demonstrate scholastic achievement, volunteer/community service, leadership qualities, and/or financial need. Some awards are program-specific. The online application, available through Online Services for Students, opens in November and closes January 15.

CONCORDIA BURSARY PROGRAM

The bursary assistance program provides non-repayable forms of financial assistance to domestic and international students on the basis of financial need and is intended to assist students who, in spite of their own best efforts, are experiencing difficulties in meeting tuition and other reasonable educational expenses while attending Concordia. The online bursary application is available through Online Services for Students. The fall term deadline is October 15 and the winter term deadline is February 1. Students may apply only once during the academic year.

MRS. SURESHT DUTT MEMORIAL PUBLIC HEALTH SCHOLARSHIP

Awarded to a student enrolled in the Bachelor of Environmental Health After Degree or the Graduate Diploma in Environmental Public Health Practice. The recipient must demonstrate academic excellence by presenting a minimum 3.3 GPA, be registered full-time, and demonstrate professionalism and community building on or off campus. **EH Degree** students apply in November: Online Services for Students / Requests / Award Applications / CUE Scholarships. **EH Diploma** students submit a Google Form. Value: \$1,100

EH STUDENT OF THE YEAR

Awarded to a Bachelor of Environmental Health After Degree student who demonstrates academic excellence, a commitment to community public health volunteerism, and engagement with the Concordia community. The recipient will have completed all three semesters of coursework within one year (12 months) before applying for the award. Executive members of the Environmental Health Students' Union are not eligible to apply. The Google Form is made available in April and the deadline to apply is August 1.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS THROUGH ALBERTA STUDENT AID

Métis Scholar Award

A \$2,500 bursary to help alleviate the cost of tuition and learning resources and to encourage the post-secondary achievement of full-time Métis undergraduate students while attending CUE. The online application, available through Online Services for Students opens in September. The deadline to apply is October 1.

Indigenous Careers Award

The \$4,000 Indigenous Careers Award is an award designed to increase access and participation of Alberta Indigenous post-secondary students and encourage them to continue and complete their studies. The award is made possible by funding from the Government of Alberta. The application is found on the Financial Aid & Awards website and is available in September. The deadline to apply is October 1.

Jason Lang Scholarship

An annual \$1,000 award to students who display outstanding academic achievement. Recipients must have completed a minimum of 80% of a full-course load and achieved a minimum Session GPA of 3.2 in the qualifying year. Recipients must also be Alberta residents and continuing full-time in the second or subsequent year of their undergraduate program at a recognized post-secondary institution in Alberta. Concordia's Financial Aid and Awards office will identify eligible students after the end of winter session and invite them to apply.

Laurence Decore Awards for Student Leadership

Four annual \$1,000 awards to domestic undergraduate students who have demonstrated commitment and leadership in student government, student societies, clubs or organizations, student organizations at the provincial or national level, or non-profit community organizations. Recipients must be enrolled full-time in the current academic year and be an Alberta resident. Application available in November & deadline to apply is January 15.

Dr. Gary McPherson Leadership Scholarship

Two annual \$2,000 awards to domestic students (undergraduate or graduate) who have demonstrated outstanding leadership, especially in the area of disability, and/or initiative to improve the conditions and lives of all people, while attending post-secondary studies in Alberta. The recipient must be enrolled full-time in the current academic year and be an Alberta resident. The application is available in November and the deadline to apply is January 15.
