This program is unique because it has built in training and education opportunities before placements are even secured. Youth will have the opportunity to connect with like-minded individuals, learn new skills and grow their personal and professional network. Those that are successful candidates for the program, will go on to learn more about municipal government with hands-on experience and opportunities to help diversity the voices that make up public service.
