

## Minors – 2026-2027

Students may not count more than 18 credits from courses outside the Faculties of Arts and Science toward a Concordia University of Edmonton Arts or Science degree. Courses offered through the Faculty of Education and the Faculty of Management are outside the Faculties of Arts and Science.

**1. Biochemistry:** 18-21 credits required, to include:

- a. BES 107
- b. CH 261
- c. BIOCH200
- d. BIOCH350
- e. 6-12 credits chosen from
  - a. BIO 344
  - b. BIO 421
  - c. CH 419
  - d. unspecified BIOCH courses

**In addition to the above courses students must complete:**

- f. CH 101
- g. CH 102

**2. Biology:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. BES 107 and BES 108
- b. 12-18 credits unspecified senior-level BIO

**3. Business:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. BUS 110
- b. BUS 120
- c. BUS 220
- d. ECO 101 and ECO 102
- e. 3-9 credits of unspecified senior-level ACCT, BUS, FIN, HRM, LDR, MGT or MARK courses

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**4. Canadian Studies:** 18-24 credits required, to include 6 credits each from three of the four general areas of study listed below with at least 6 credits at the senior level:

- a. CREE 101, CREE 102, ENG 280, ENG 380, ENG 381, ENG 382, ENG 383, ENG 384, ENG 409, FR 250, FR 251, FR 252, FR 300, NS 152
- b. HIS 260, HIS 261, HIS 365, HIS 366, HIS 369, HIS 370, HIS 415, HIS 416 or any INDG course
- c. BUS 110, ECO 101, ECO 102, ECO 341, ECO 369, PSCI224, PSCI225, MARK201
- d. SOC 101, SOC 204, SOC 271, SOC 327, SOC 368, SOC 369, SOC 376

**5. Career Development:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

**6. Chemistry:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. CH 101 and CH 102
- b. 12-18 credits of unspecified CH courses with at least 6 credits at the senior-level (may include BIOCH 200)

**7. Classical Languages and Civilizations:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. 3 credits unspecified CLAS courses
- b. 6 credits unspecified HEBR, LAT or GRK courses
- c. 9-15 credits chosen from unspecified CLAS, HEBR, LAT, or GRK courses; PHIL240, REL 101, REL 102, REL 252, REL 253, REL 302, REL 320, REL 321, REL 322, REL 323, REL 331, REL 332, REL 337, REL 338, REL 339, REL 342, REL 362, REL 364, REL 365, REL 367, REL 369, REL 383, or REL 385

**8. Criminology:** 18–24 credits required, with at least 6 credits at the senior-level, to include:

- a. SOC 102
- b. SOC 225
- c. One of SOC 224 or SOC 260
- d. One of SOC 321, SOC 327, SOC 333, PSY 350, or INDG 330
- e. 3 credits of unspecified SOC courses
- f. 3-9 credits of unspecified SOC courses at the senior-level (*SOC 210, SOC 315, and/or SOC 332 is recommended*)

**9. Drama:** 18-24 credits required, with at least 6 credits at the senior-level, to include:

- g. DRA 101 or 102
- h. One of DRA 149, 325 or 353
- i. One of DRA 247 or 252
- j. 9-15 credits of unspecified DRA courses

**10. Early Childhood Education:** 18-24 credits required, with at least 9 credits at the senior-level, to include:

- a. ED 199
- b. EDPS200
- c. PESS293
- d. EDFD211
- e. EDFD321 or ENG 399
- f. EDFD341
- g. 0-6 credits chosen from EDPS341, EDIE 325, EDIE 326, HIS 368, HIS 369, MUED213, PESS, PACT, PAT or DAN courses

**11. Ecology:** 18–24 credits required to include:

- a. BES 108 and ECOL208
- b. 9-15 credits of unspecified senior-level ECOL courses-
- c. 3-6 credits chosen from BIO 205, BIO 304, ENSC270, ENSC346

**12. Economics:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- d. ECO 101 and 102
- e. 12-18 credits of unspecified senior-level ECO courses

**Note:** Management students wanting to pursue an Economics minor should contact a Registration Advisor for further details.

**13. Education:** 18-24 credits required, with at least 9 credits at the senior level, to include:

- a. ED 199
- b. EDPS200
- c. PESS293
- d. 6-9 credits chosen from ED 300, EDIE 325, EDFD321 or ENG 399, EDFD341, EDPS341, HIS 368, HIS 369 or MUED214
- e. 3-6 credits chosen from PESS, PACT, PAT or DAN courses or EDIE 326

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**14. English:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. 6 credits of junior-level ENG (Recommended: ENG 111 and ENG 112)
- b. 12-18 credits of unspecified senior-level ENG courses

**15. Environmental Science:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. BES 108
- b. ENSC104
- c. ECOL 208 or ENSC208
- d. 9-15 credits of unspecified senior-level ENSC courses

**16. Forensic Science:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. FSC 101
- b. FSC 203
- c. FSC 225
- d. 9-15 credits chosen from BIO 207, BIO 260, CH 313, CH 419, SOC 225, SOC 321 or SOC 327, PSY 350

In addition to the above, students must complete:

- e. CH 150 or CH 101
- f. BIO 100 or BES 107 or BES 108

**17. French:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. FR 211 and 212
- b. FR 251 and 252
- c. 6 credits of 300- or 400-level FR courses
- d. 0-6 credits of unspecified FR courses

**18. History:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. Unspecified HIS courses with at least 6 credits at the senior-level

**19. Indigenous Studies:** 18-24 credits required to include:

- a. INDG 100
- b. INDG 200
- c. INDG 290
- d. 9-15 credits chosen from CREE 101, CREE 102, ENG 388, HIS 368, HIS 369, HIS 464, INDG 111, INDG 330, INDG 340, INDG 391, INDG 490 and SOC 204

**20. Information Technology and Computing Science:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. Unspecified IT and/or CMPT courses with a maximum of 9 credits at the junior-level.

**21. Mathematics:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. MAT 113 or 114
- b. MAT 115 and 120
- c. MAT 151
- d. MAT 200
- e. 3-9 credits of unspecified senior-level MAT courses

**22. Music:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. MUS 211
- b. One of MUS 261, 262, 263, 281, 282 or any course from the MUS 380-series
- c. 3 credits of unspecified MUP courses
- d. 9-15 credits of unspecified MUS or MUP courses, at least 6 of which must be MUS courses and at least 6 of which must be at the senior-level.

**23. Philosophy:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. PHIL102 or PHIL202
- b. PHIL125
- c. 12-18 credits of unspecified PHIL courses with at least 9 credits at the senior-level



**24. Physical Education and Sport Studies:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. PESS 101
- b. One of PESS 231, 245, 345, or SOC 230
- c. One of PESS 201, 293 or PESS 301
- d. 6 credits chosen from PACT, PAT or DAN courses
- e. 3-9 further credits chosen from PESS 201, 231, 245, 293, 301, 330, 345, SOC 230 or any PACT, PAT or DAN courses.

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**25. Physics:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. One of PHY 111 or 121 or 131
- b. PHY 122 or 132
- c. 12-18 credits chosen from unspecified senior-level PHY courses, EAS 371

**26. Political Science:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. PSCI101 and PSCI102
- b. PSCI224
- c. 9-15 credits of unspecified senior-level PSCI courses

**27. Psychology:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. PSY 104 and 105
- b. 12-18 credits of unspecified senior-level PSY courses

**28. Religious Studies:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. 6 credits chosen from REL 101, 102, 103
- b. 12-18 credits chosen from: up to 3 credits of unspecified POPC courses, unspecified senior-level REL courses.

**29. Sociology:** 18-24 credits required, to include:

- a. SOC 100
- b. 15-21 credits of unspecified SOC courses with at least 6 credits at the senior-level

**30. Sustainable Earth Resources and Geoscience:** 18-24 credits required to include:

- a. EAS 101 and EAS 102
- b. 6 credits of unspecified senior-level EAS courses
- c. 6-12 credits chosen from: unspecified EAS, PHY 220, ENSC220, ENSC223, ENSC270
