

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION (AFTER DEGREE)

The Bachelor of Education (After Degree) is a two-year elementary generalist program leading to a degree that fulfills the requirements for certification as a teacher in Alberta. The BEd (AD) is comprised of four semesters. Studies throughout the program are designed around the competencies that are defined by Alberta Education's Teaching Quality Standard.

YEAR ONE, SEMESTER ONE – FOUNDATION

15 CREDITS

EDUC 501 – Introduction to Planning in the Elementary School

EDUC 551 – The Organizational Framework of Teaching

Year One Field Experience (Part 1) – Students visit schools over a six month period, spending a minimum of 10 half days in schools.

In addition to the above, students must present: A IT 100 (Undergraduate Academic Integrity Training)

YEAR ONE, SEMESTER TWO – INSTRUCTION 1

15 CREDITS

EDUC 511 – Curriculum Design and Instructional Methods in the Elementary School

(Core subject areas: Language Arts, English Language Learning, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, Physical Education and Health, and Art. Elective subject areas: Early Childhood Education (Kindergarten), Music, Second Languages.)
