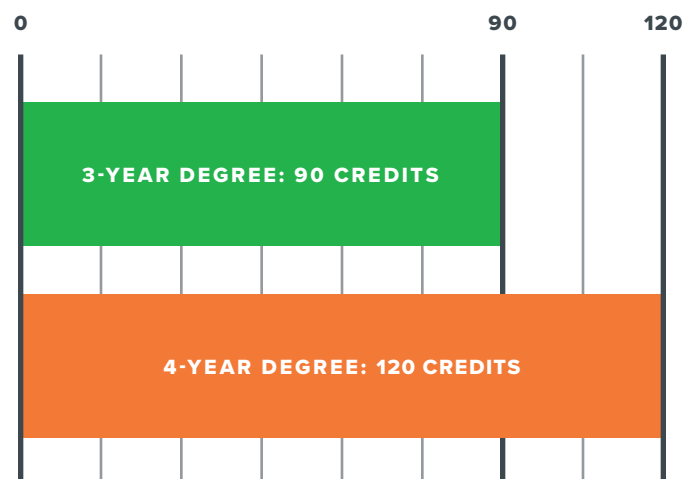
DEMYSTIFYING THE DETAILS

Post-secondary institutions love acronyms and jargon, but we believe in keeping things simple. Here is your cheat sheet to understanding how university works, choosing the right degree path, and decoding the lingo.

3-YEAR VS. 4-YEAR DEGREES: WHICH IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

A **three-year bachelor's degree** is fully accredited across Canada, and prepares you for after degree programs, such as the Bachelor of Education or Bachelor of Environmental Health here at CUE. If you know your goals, want a fast track into the workforce, or plan for a professional after degree, our three-year bachelor's degree programs might be the perfect fit for you!

Our **four-year bachelor's degree** programs offer the classic, comprehensive university experience. Featuring more specialized emphases and majors, and advanced senior level classes, choose this route if you want immersive expertise in your field, or if you plan to apply for graduate school (like a master's degree or PhD).





TERMINOLOGY

ADMISSION: The formal "You're in!" letter confirming your official acceptance into a specific CUE program.

AFTER DEGREE: A condensed, additional degree completed after you already have a bachelor's degree, allowing you to earn a second distinct credential that can open career paths quickly (e.g., becoming a teacher).

APPLICATION/APPLYING: Your formal request to join CUE as a student, submitted digitally via ApplyAlberta.

BURSARY: A bursary is financial assistance awarded on the basis of financial need. Bursaries supplement, not replace, other forms of financial aid. Like scholarships, these are a gift and do not need to be paid back.

CONCENTRATION: The primary area of study in a three-year degree program.

CREDIT: The numerical value assigned to a course, normally based upon the number of contact/classroom hours per week. Most standard, single-semester classes at CUE are worth three credits.

DISCIPLINE: A subject area or field of study (e.g., English, Religious Studies, Biology).

ELECTIVE: A course that is not explicitly required for your specific major or program of study; perfect for satisfying your curiosity, trying something new, or fulfilling credit requirements.

EMPHASIS: A specific area of focus or study within a broader major or degree program.

GRANT: A form of financial aid for education, often provided by governments or organizations based on need, such as low income or disabilities. Unlike loans, grants do not require repayment unless your eligibility changes (e.g., withdrawing from school or dropping to part-time studies).

MAJOR: Your primary area of study in a four-year degree program.

MINOR: Your secondary area of study in a three- or four-year degree program.

REGISTRATION: The process where admitted CUE students select secure their spot in courses relevant to their degree.

SCHOLARSHIP: A form of financial aid provided by government, organizations, CUE, or private donors on the basis of meeting specific criteria. Scholarships do not require repayment, and one student can receive multiple scholarships.

TUITION: The core cost of your post-secondary program, usually referred to on a per-year basis.

UNDERGRADUATE: A foundational level of post-secondary education (e.g. a bachelor's degree), and a necessary requirement for any graduate or after degree programs.

While many graduates become public health inspectors, your specialized training can open doors to an array of high-impact roles, including public policy analyst, health risk assessor, air pollution analyst/specialist, environmental health officer, infection prevention and control specialist, food safety and quality assurance manager, communicable disease investigator, and more.

THE PATH TO BECOMING A PUBLIC HEALTH INSPECTOR

To practice as a certified Public Health Inspector in Canada, your journey includes two key real-world steps after your CUE coursework:

- 1 The 12-Week Practicum Placement:** The hands-on experience to build the skills and confidence to manage community health risks.
- 2 The National Exam:** Take the CIPHI Board of Certification exam to earn your official public health inspector credential.

FAQs

Q: I'm an international student. Can I complete the practicum placement?

A: This depends on the conditions of your study/work permit. If you are allowed to work in Canada, you may be allowed to complete the practicum placement.

Q: Where will my practicum placement take place?

A: You can apply to a CIPHI approved health authority anywhere in Canada to complete your practicum. You will have the opportunity to apply to Alberta Health Services for a practicum position.

Q: How do I apply for residence?

A: Once a student has received admission to CUE, along with their CUE student email, students can apply to residence through Online Services.

Q: Do I get to pick my roommate?

A: Fill out your application with as much detail as possible. Hobbies, interests, lifestyle, etc. If there is another student registered to CUE that they would like to be roommates with, simply include their name in the application and we will make the match.

Q: Is the meal plan mandatory for all students?

A: The meal plan is mandatory for all students in residence. If a student has a dietary restriction, please let us know as soon as possible, so we can evaluate the student's eligibility for an exemption.

YOUR ROADMAP TO CUE

ADMISSIONS FAQs AND TIMELINE

Taking the leap from high school to university is an exciting milestone, and we are here to make the transition as smooth as possible. Here, you'll find the answers to common questions and important dates. Keep this guide handy so you never miss a deadline, an event, or an opportunity to secure your future at CUE.

Q: When is the best time to apply?

A: Right now! Applying early is the best strategy. It gives you a head start on applying for scholarships, unlocks early access to course registration so you can build your ideal class schedule, and ensures you secure a seat before programs fill up.

Q: What are the official application deadlines?**A: Fall Term (September start):**

Domestic applications close June 30.

Winter Term (January start):

Domestic applications close November 1.

Note: International student deadlines are earlier; check online for specific cutoff dates.

Q: What if I have questions about my application?

A: We have answers! CUE staff are ready to help you with application and registration questions via phone, email, or in-person on campus.

Q: What if I haven't finished my grade 12 courses yet?

A: Don't worry, you don't have to wait until graduation! You can secure a conditional offer of admission. In your application, simply list the five required grade 12 courses for your chosen program. These courses can be completed, currently in progress, or ones you are registered to take later in the school year. Provide at least two final or estimated grades, and our Admissions team can evaluate you for early admission.

Q: Can I get an extension on paying my registration deposit?

A: Deposit extensions are evaluated on a case-by-case basis and depend on the current enrolment in your program. If you require an extension, we highly recommend contacting your Admissions Advisor as soon as possible to discuss your options and request one.

Q: How long will it take to hear back about my application?

A: We work fast! New applications are processed the next business day after they are received. Once processed, you can typically expect an update from your Admissions Advisor within just one week.

Q: What's the competitive average for admission?

A: Admission to our direct-entry undergraduate programs is non-competitive. If you meet or exceed the minimum average required for your program, you're in! However, seats are filled on a first-come, first-served basis, so apply early.

Q: How do I submit my high school transcripts?

A: If you attended high school in Alberta, we request them for you! If you are applying from a high school outside of Alberta, you can send them using MyCreds or contact your Admissions Advisor for more options.

Q: Which of my courses will be used to calculate my admission average?

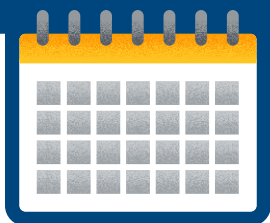
A: We look at your transcript and use your highest qualifying grades across the specific subject categories required by your chosen program. We always use your best marks to give you the highest possible average.

Q: Can I change my major or minor later?

A: Absolutely! It is common for students to pivot once they discover new passions in university. A Registration Advisor can help you adjust your major or minor track and understand your program of study.

Q: Are our classes offered online or in-person?

A: CUE is proudly relationship-driven and student-focused. To deliver the high-impact mentorship, personalization, and community we are famous for, most classes are delivered in-person on our beautiful campus overlooking the North Saskatchewan river valley.

Use Your Legal Name: Ensure you use your full legal name on your application exactly as it appears on your official high school transcripts and government identification. You can include a preferred name for us to address you by in the application process.

List a Minimum of Two Grades: Always include at least two high school course grades (whether completed or currently in progress) on your application to allow our team to evaluate you for conditional admission.

Keep an Eye on Your Inbox: Once you submit your application you'll receive an email with a link to your Applicant Portal. Make sure to check your email regularly (including your junk/spam folder), as all official updates, document requests, and admission offers will be sent straight to your inbox.
